1 - Patience Towards One Another

- Patience is tested when conflict or offense comes
- Jesus showed extraordinary patience with his followers who failed
- Patience means bearing with and forgiving others as the Lord has shown patience and forgiven us
- Patience requires God's help and grace
- Patience leads to redemption and growth

2 - Seek Understanding

- Judging by appearances leads to misunderstanding and conflict
- Jesus taught us to judge correctly and look deeper
- Accepting one another as Christ accepted us requires empathy and humility
- Seeking understanding means listening, asking, and giving the benefit of the doubt
- Extending grace means offering empathy, not judgment
- Following Jesus' example means making understanding a priority

3 - Embrace Realistic Expectations

- Idealizing church life leads to disappointment and frustration
- We are all works in progress, not yet perfect
- We must hold each other accountable, but show grace/forgiveness
- By God's grace, weak and broken people can serve Him powerfully
- See each other as God does, with value, purpose, and potential
- Allow room for growth and maturity
- Realistic expectations builds a healthy and authentic church family

4 - Keep First Things First

- Don't lose sight of our greater purpose justice, mercy, and faithfulness

- Together, with God's help, let's keep first things first
